

Walk from the Suburb to Toynbee Hall

Starting at St Jude's Car Park, and downhill all the way once past the Spaniards Inn, join the eight mile walk for an enjoyable day out. Sponsorship from your friends and family will raise money for the much needed work of Toynbee Hall in Whitechapel, founded by Henrietta Barnett, founder of Hampstead Garden Suburb.

The walk takes you through the Heath Extension, across Sandy Heath, across the main Heath to Gospel Oak before joining the tow path of the Grand Union Canal at Camden Lock. Then continue on the tow path by St Pancras, Kings X and into Islington where the canal goes into a tunnel and we detour into Chapel Market for refreshments before re-joining the path at Duncan Terrace dating from 1761.

On to Haggerston and south towards Brick Lane and Fournier Street where the 18th century houses have beautiful doorways. There will be a chance to see Christ Church Spitafields before tea and look around Toynbee Hall.

The return journey is by tube from Aldgate East.
